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#### Candidate's Statement

I think, the biggest problems of our region (Russia and NIS) are:

1. Subspecialties of nephrology such as interventional nephrology, renal pathology, critical care nephrology, kidney transplantation are severely underdeveloped or distributed unevenly among the countries.
2. Low number of members.
3. Language barrier.

I would suggest next strategies:

1. Develop program like ISN Educational Ambassadors but with longer duration of stay (up to 6-12-18 months because visiting specialist have to see the real changes his/her training gave) in close cooperation with local National Health Services.
2. Explore the pricing options of ISN membership in the region.
3. Develop some educational activities, like ISN Academy webinars, in Russian or organize professional translations of existing seminars in English to Russian.
