I graduated from Medical University of Bialystok and received M.D. (diploma with distinction for the highest notes) in 1989. I did my residency and fellowship at Department of Nephrology and Internal Medicine (later renamed as Department of Nephrology and Transplantation with Dialysis Unit), Medical University of Bialystok, Poland. I am board certified specialist in internal medicine, nephrology, clinical transplantation, hypertension and

diabetology. In 1995 I received Ph.D. at Hamamatsu University School of Medicine, Japan. I organized from scratch peritoneal dialysis program and outpatient hypertension clinic and later 2nd Department of Nephrology and Hypertension with Dialysis Subunit at the Medical University of Bialystok. In March 2018 I moved to Warsaw and became a head of Department of Nephrology, Dialysis and Internal Medicine, Warsaw Medical University from December 2018.

My clinical training was performed at the Intensive Care Unit with Toxicology Center, Nephrology Department, CHU Rouen, France, Department of Nephrology and Rheumatology, Dusseldorf, Germany (EDTA-ERA scholarship), King's College of London, UK, Ichilov Hospital, Tel Aviv, Israel. I am European Specialist in Clinical Hypertension. In January 2007 I became FASN, in 2013 -FERA. I am a member of the Executive Council of the Polish Society of Nephrology and Secretary General of the Polish Society of Transplantation. I was a member of EDRA-EDTA Executive Council (2015-2018). Now I am a member of the Executive Council of KDIGO (term 2019-2021). I was a co-chair of KDIGO Controversy Conference on onconephrology (Milan December 2018).

My major research interest are: hypertension, cardiovascular complications in CKD, iron metabolism and anemia in CKD, onconephrology and biomarkers of AKI. I am author and coauthor of over 600 original papers in peer-reviewed journals, over 100 review papers and over 50 book chapters including Oxford Textbook of Clinical Nephrology (2015) (IF $^{\sim}$ 1000, citations over 7000 and h-index-38).

Based on my long -term collaboration on national and international basis I would further support regional collaboration. As our region may differ from Western Europe in many aspects, I would opt for more regional projects both clinical and scientific in areas understudied thoroughly so far as AKI (epidemiology, outcomes, need for RRT, its modalities), registries, availability of different RRT (like HDF), more scientific exchange and collaboration.
