Dr Xueqing YU, Professor of Medicine, serves as the president of Guangdong Provincial People's Hospital/Guangdong Academy of Medical Sciences. He received both MD (1984) and PhD (1996) in Sun Yat-sen University, post-doctoral training at Monash Medical Center in Australia (1996-1997), and

visiting professorship at Baylor College of Medicine, USA (2002). Dr Yu has played a leading role nationally and internationally in education, patient care, and research. He has a mentorship for over 40 postgraduate students and post-doctoral fellows and leads the national kidney center in China, consisting of over 106 kidney patient beds and 32 nephrologists/researchers. With 443 publications, his research focuses on prevention and molecular mechanisms of glomerulonephritis and PD-related complications. He has received 52 research grants, numerous prizes and recognitions, including the second prize in National Advanced Science and Technology Award. Dr Yu is now serving as the President of ISPD, Executive member of Asian-Pacific Society of Nephrology and Chair of CME committee, Editor board member of *Kidney International* and *American Journal Kidney Diseases*, subject editor of *Nephrology*. He is very active to organize the World Kidney Day in China.
