Based on my long -term collaboration on national and international basis I would further support regional collaboration. As our region may differ from Western Europe in many aspects, I would opt for more regional projects both clinical and scientific in areas understudied thoroughly so far as AKI (epidemiology, outcomes, need for RRT, its modalities), registries, availability of different RRT (like HDF), more scientific exchange and collaboration.

As I was involved in PD programme and education programme in PD in my previous post, and now I continue my activities at Warsaw Medical University. I would promote collaboration in the field of PD and closer ties with ISPD.
